

Study to Improve South Norwalk Train Station Area as a Transportation Hub

The Norwalk Transit District, with support from the City of Norwalk, is conducting a study to improve the South Norwalk Railroad Station and surrounding area. The purpose of the study is to provide seamless connections for passengers arriving by train, bus, taxi, shuttle, automobile, bicycle, or on foot. The study will also look at opportunities for commercial and residential development within walking distance of the South Norwalk transit hub.

Ideas to improve the South Norwalk Railroad Station were shared by area residents, businesses, community associations, and commuters at five meetings in June. This information, as well as a study of traffic, environmental, and economic conditions, will be used to develop draft alternative plans.

The public is encouraged to share its views on the preliminary plans (available late July) at two scheduled public meetings.
